## **BULLDOG BASH GAME RULES**

## **Special Rules for Tournament**

(NFHS with the following modifications)

- Games 38 Minute Running Game (2-19 min halves with 1 min halftime)
- Timeouts ONE 45 sec timeout will be allowed in the first 15 minutes of the game
- <u>Counts</u> -We will have 20 second and 10 second counts, however, the officials have been instructed to have "slow counts" Meaning unless a team is deliberately stalling, the officials will give the team the benefit of doubt regarding getting the ball out of the defensive end and into the offensive box.
- Over & Back In affect after touch in the attack box
- **Substitutions** Are "on the fly" through the box

## Penalties

- SUNDAY Time Serving :45 running for 30 second penalties, and 1:15 running for 1 minute penalties.
- SATURDAY All divisions will have fast breaks awarded to the team that was fouled. The only exception to this would be if BOTH coaches want to play Man-Up prior to the contest. This does not make the ENTIRE division play that way, just that game.
- Fouled team may choose midfielder who will start the break. He will be given a 5-yard head start.
- <u>Flag Down Slow Whistle</u> For <u>Saturday</u>, play is stopped when ball is grounded. <u>Sunday</u> continuation-per NCAA
- Slashing One-handed checks are legal. Must be controlled. Official's discretion.
- <u>Body Checks</u> LIMITED CHECKING IN THE YOUTH DIVISIONS, TRY TO HAVE TEAM PLAY THE BALL. Over aggressive play will NOT BE TOLERATED.
- <u>Alternate Possession</u> award first to team winning opening faceoff.
- <u>Sportsmanship</u> Cheap shots and dirty play may result in expulsion from the game and possible suspension from the entire tournament without refund.
- <u>Fights</u> Any type of fighting could result in the teams' suspension from the tournament without refund.
- <u>Tie Games</u> 1 minute BRAVEHEART (Goalie + 2). If time expires on the Braveheart, the game ends in a tie. Tie Breakers for the division are in the following order: Record, Head to head competition, goal differential, goals against, and finally goals for.
- <u>Coaches</u> -Are expected to have complete control over their team and spectators. They should try to refrain from yelling at officials.
